Read the following passage carefully, then answer the questions below:

There is a 41-year-old woman, from California known as Anna, who remembers almost every day of her life since she was 11. On the other hand, there is an 85-year-old man known as Eddy, who can only remember his most recent thought. Anna might have the best memory in the world. Eddy could very well have the worst.

Eddy is warm, charming and friendly. He laughs a lot. 15 years ago; an unknown virus attacked his brain and destroyed the part where memories are made. He cannot remember his childhood or being a soldier in the army. Since his illness, the only people he knows are the ones in the room with him. On a typical morning, he gets up and has breakfast, then goes back to bed to listen to the radio. Sometimes, he forgets that he has eaten, so he gets up and has breakfast again and returns to bed. Without a memory, he is **trapped** in the present, between a past he can't remember and a future he can't imagine. He lives a peaceful life and doesn't even know that he has a memory problem.

For Anna, in contrast, the past is always there. "My memory flows like a movie", she says. She remembers who called her on the phone at 12:34 on Sunday August 3, 1986. She remembers great world events and shopping trips. She remembers the cold weather and the snow. She remembers that on March 28, 1992, she had lunch with her father at the Beverly Hills hotel. She remembers what **they** ate and every word of the conversation. Every day is there, every detail. Anna believes it is something that happens to her naturally, but it is not an ability she welcomes. "I remember the good things, which is nice. But I also remember the bad things. I wish for just five minutes to be able to forget all the bad things in my head. Most people call it a gift. But I call it a problem."



Scientists are unsure why Anna's memory is so extraordinary or why Eddy's memory is so weak, but both of these cases demonstrate the importance of memory. Eddy's case shows us how essential memory is for us to function; but Anna's shows that if our memories are to function properly, we also need to be able to forget.

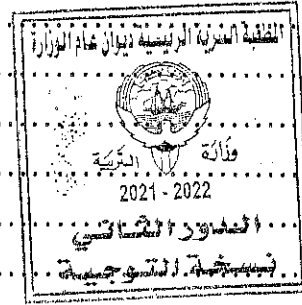
